Strontium Chloride Sr-89 (METASTRON)

POLICY

I. INDICATIONS

The indications below including FDA-approved indications and compendial uses are considered a covered benefit provided that all the approval criteria are met and the member has no exclusions to the prescribed therapy.

FDA-Approved Indication

Indicated for the relief of bone pain in patients with painful skeletal metastases.

All other indications will be assessed on an individual basis. Submissions for indications other than those enumerated in this policy should be accompanied by supporting evidence from Medicare approved compendia.

II. DOCUMENTATION

The following documentation must be available, upon request, for all submissions:
Documentation of the presence of bone metastases

III. CRITERIA FOR INITIAL APPROVAL

Malignant Bone Pain

Authorization of 12 months may be granted for the relief of bone pain when all of the following criteria are met:

1. The member has a malignant/cancer diagnosis
2. The member has bone metastases

IV. CONTINUATION OF THERAPY

All members (including new members) requesting authorization for continuation of therapy must be currently receiving therapy with the requested agent.

Authorization of 12 months may be granted when all of the following criteria are met:

1. The member is currently receiving therapy with the requested medication
2. The requested medication is being used to treat an indication enumerated in Section III
3. There is no evidence of unacceptable toxicity while on the current regimen
